Raising student issues

- Once a student reports a disability/health related issue to a staff member we are deemed to be
 aware > we need to make sure this is reported up the chain so they can get the needed support
 - You must not simply ignore this and take no action!
- Please report this to the student office immediately so they can flag and escalate it
 - With the Departmental Disability Contacts in cc
 - For Y1 and new issues to Carl; for Y4 and ongoing issues to Neil
 - For others or for particularly complex cases to both of us

Note: there is no confidentiality breach if you are only passing it on to people that need to know
